## Dear Friends,

One of the blessings of being in the Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod is that we have the resources, company, council, and companionship of a larger church body while also making our own decisions about our own congregation. At our April Voters meeting, on April 21st, we will engage an issue that has lurked around in the background of our congregation for at least the last 10 years. What do we do with our east property? Some of you are very aware of the history around that land and some of you do not even know we own it.

The empty (except for a storage shed) two acre lot that lies to the east of our church property, is owned by Apostles. The land was bought about 30 years ago as part of a dream to eventually build a middle school. However, dynamics, times and needs have changed, and that dream is no longer part of our congregation.

Currently, we use part of that property for overflow parking and occasionally rent it out as a staging area for different construction companies. In the past we have been able to pay the mortgage and maintain the property. The mortgage on the undeveloped property has now come due and we have to refinance it at a higher rate, which will mean higher costs for the undeveloped property. Currently the mortgage note on that property is about \$295,000 and is held by the Lutheran Church Extension Fund. With our current resources we cannot afford the new payments. So the question is what do we do with that piece of property? At our Voters' Meeting on April 21<sup>st</sup> we will vote whether or not to put the undeveloped property up for sale. If we vote to keep that parcel of land we are also committing to finding a way to pay the increased cost. If we vote to put it up for sale we will, of course, at a minimum ask for enough to cover the outstanding debt and costs associated with the sale.

If we sell that undeveloped parcel we are not giving up on our plans for growth. The current buildings and space we have on our developed property are adequate to house a congregation of at least 500 - 600 people, which is nowhere near our current or projected membership. We have nowhere near exhausted the uses of our current building site.

I know the sale or use of that parcel of land has been a contentious issue all the time I have been at this congregation and even before my time as your pastor. I do not want our discussion on April 21<sup>st</sup> to lead to more division. I would like our discussion on April 21<sup>st</sup> to lead to healing and realistic plans to move into the future. This is possible if we all remember that Jesus is the one in charge of our congregation. He has our best interest at heart and all the resources we need to carry on the work of our congregation. It is also possible if we love our neighbor as ourselves including the neighbors in our congregation. Please be in prayer about this and come to the Voter's Assembly meeting on April 21<sup>st</sup> at 12:30.

# "New Earth"

Every New Year brings new resolutions, new plans, new beginnings and lots of new opportunities and challenges. I have often been curious about God's plans for "New Heavens and a New Earth." What does this mean? Does it mean renewal, or does it mean a whole new planet or a whole new cosmos? There is a man and wife couple north of Tilden, Nebraska who sell tons of African Night Crawlers castings (night crawler manure) for improving the fertility of gardens and production agriculture. Soil experts agree that the castings help establish a microbial environment that releases natural occurring nutrients into the soil. The worms make "new earth" out of old earth.

There is another farmer in Lancaster County, Nebraska who claims that keeping "cover crops" on the soil, year-round allows nature to do its work in renewing the soil and in the water-holding-capacity. The roots of the cover crop allow the microbes to have a food source even in winter.

I believe that the worm castings and the cover crops are good renewal practices, but these things have been around for a very long time. These practices are probably new to most of us, but they are not new. What about "new earth" do we get that by following good old/new farming practices? Or do we get it by listening to what God/Jesus says about it?

He who is seated on the Throne said, 'Behold I am making all things new." Seven hundred years earlier He said, "Behold, I will create new heavens and a new earth. The former things will not be remembered, nor will they come to mind."

This is the same "new earth" Person who gathered with His disciples on the night before his death and said to them, "Drink of it all, for this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for many for the forgiveness of sins."

There are lots of "new's" in God's New Earth Plan.

A new command I give you: "Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another."

I pray that this New Year will bring God's "New Earth Plan" to you and to God's Good Earth.

# Sharing Jesus One Plate of Food at a Time

The Gulf Coast Region of the United States is hit annually with hurricanes, flooding, and tornadoes. In the aftermath of the disaster, people's lives are turned upside down. Their homes may need extensive repair, electrical service is down, and food is scarce. It is in these situations that Forged by Fire Services, an LCMS Recognized Service Organization (RSO), based in LaCombe, Louisiana, reaches out with meals.

Forged by Fire volunteers come into a community with their kitchen equipment in cargo style trailers. They establish a base camp near a Lutheran Church in the disaster affected community. They set up their tent and kitchen and prepare meals for the community. The tent requires a large area and sometimes the weather conditions make the meal preparation and service difficult. Going forward they want to purchase a mobile kitchen trailer. With the trailer they can easily begin helping in areas needing assistance. This grant will help purchase the mobile kitchen trailer.

The volunteers prepare meals to feed those who've suffered losses because of the natural disasters. The served meals help their physical bodies, but they also receive help for their spiritual needs. Working with local churches allows the congregations to help serve and connect with their hurting community. Someone is available to speak with those in need and point them in the right direction for help, prayers are offered, and resources such as devotionals and Bibles are shared. It is during the darkest times for the people that hope is given, with a vision of better days ahead.
